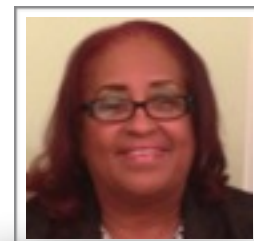
Track- Dr. Emily Craig
